

Is the Signature Real?

A Genuine Signature is one of the Most Complex Problems to Determine. The only Way to be sure that Your Signature will Stay Genuine or Authentic is to Sign in Front of them and You **See the Other Person Sign in Front of You**. There are Several Ways that a FAKE Signature can be Produced.

The First is the **AUTO PEN. A Machine that can Sign Your Name** or of Anyone. Another Way is for Someone else as an Example is a Secretary that Signs for a Boss, Supervisor, Aunt, Uncle, Mom or Dad to a Friend. Also, the use of a Rubber Stamp can be used or a Printed Signature that can Look Real.

The Auto Pen

The Auto Pen is a Machine which can Sign a Signature or Autograph (which is the same thing) in Your Handwriting or Printing or Anyone's Handwriting. The Auto Pen was Developed in the Early Part of this Century but became Popular in the 1940's.

To Create an Auto Pen Signature is as Follows: You Sign Your Name once on a Sheet of Paper, and a Pattern or Template is Created for the Machine at the Auto Pen Company. When the Template is Installed, the Auto Pen Machine is then able to Re-Create the Signature. The Item to be Signed is Inserted Under the Arm, the Motor is Turned on, and the Pen Moves According to the Matrix Design.

Signature that is Produced is Identical to the Individuals Own Signature. But Now - it Can be Produced at a Rate of Hundreds per Hour by Anyone or a Secretary that knows How to Use the Auto Pen Machine. Since the Resulting Signature is in the Handwriting of the Genuine Person or Celebrity and it is Drawn with an Actual Pen, the

only Way to Tell if a Signature is an Auto Pen is to Compare it to a Known Sample of the Pattern. There are Several Ways to Tell You If You Suspect that a Signature is an Auto Pen. Look for these Signs.

- A Shaky Signature Indicates Movement while the Machine is in Operation.
- A Light Signature, Especially One that Does Not Have Variation in Pressure as seen by an Indentation in the Paper when Viewed in Proper Light.
- Abrupt Pen Stops.
- A "Drawn" Look to the Signature.

Secretarial Signatures

A Secretarial Signature is when a Secretary or Administrative Assistant Signs for a Person or "Boss" and Forges His or Her Name. These are Hard to Spot, since Most Secretaries become very adept at Signing that Signature. Many People Mistake this kind of Signature is for Real because it is usually on a Corporate Letter Head that Looks Official and it is Never Questioned.

Stamped and Printed Signatures

Be Very Careful with Printed and Stamped Signatures. Printed Signatures can be Very Tricky. One Trick is to Tilt the Signature into an Oblique Light Source, Ink Signatures will usually Glow Purple, or at least a Color Difference will show from the Rest of the Image of the Signature. Stamped Signatures have a "Drawn" Look to them, and will Have Inconsistent Ink Distribution.

Forgeries
